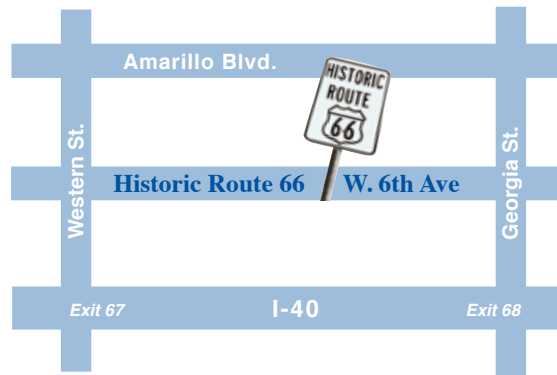

# Eat, Drink & Antique



One look at the fantastic 1939 art deco architecture on **Dale Johns Exclusive Design Studio** and you will know that you have arrived on Historic Route 66! 2700 W. 6th Ave. is also home to our award-winning float.



With its rounded windows, the **Pink Flamingo Antique Shop** was an ice cream shop built by the Borden Co. in 1930's. In the 50's & 60's it was the Sage Brush Cafe. Located at 3120 W 6th Ave.



Built in 1929 the **Blue Sage Art Gallery** is home to unique art and pottery. It also features the real food cafe. Located at 3302 W. 6th Ave.

Built in 1929 it was once Best Maid Food Co. located at 3211 W. 6th Ave. **Photography by Tracy**, with its gingerbread whimsy design, is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



The vintage 1939 art deco architecture of **Seven Brothers Mercantile** is as unique as the items you will find inside 2920 W. 6th Ave.



**Smokey Joe's Cafe** at 2903 W. 6th Ave. offers lunch and dinner as well as a gathering place to have a beer with friends inside or out on the patio! Built in the 1950's as a fruit market

Built in 1924 & located at 2727 W. 6th Ave. **Whispering Pines Antiques** specializes in the rustic and was once the Linville Drug Store.



**Wilson Electric Lamp Co.** at 2912 W. 6th Ave. and a part of Historic Route 66 since 1942 wears one of the murals that adorns The Mother Road.



Listed on the National Register of Historic Places the **Paper Hat & Tom Foolery Antique Shop** is in a two-story home built in 1945 at 6th & Maryland.
