


Introduction

- All data was collected by the Cape Fear Wildlife Expo staff during the event from 17-19 March 2017.
- The Cape Fear Wildlife Expo management estimated **15,000** attendees prior to the event.
- There were 536 completed surveys.
- Using the 15,000 attendees, the Confidence Interval for this presentation with a 536 Sample Size is +/- 4.16%. Because of the size of the sample the Confidence Interval surpassed the "best practice" of +/- 5%.

Overview


- Only 2 of the 536 completed surveys provided an invalid zip code.
- 513 were from North Carolina and 40 were from more than 100 miles from Fayetteville.
- 45 identified themselves as being here specifically for the event and overnighting in a hotel.





Bottom Line

- All Tourism Development Authority (TDA) requirements were met.
- The sample size was **excellent** and **exceeded** the "best practices" for sample versus participants.
- Of those participants staying at a hotel, the overall average length of stay was 3 nights.
- 8.41% of participants (45) were overnighters and came specifically for the event extrapolated out to 15,000 participants this means potentially 1,262 people X 3 nights = 3,786 room nights (+/-4.16%)
- 8 participants were referred by hotels.
- 44.67% were from Cumberland County, including Fort Bragg.
- 40.19% were day-trippers.
- Participants heard of the event mainly by Word of Mouth (27%) and Radio (22%).
- 179 attendees signed up for the FACVB's E-Promotion Program and provided a valid E-mail address.
- Those that came for the event and stayed at a hotel listed the following hotels; Holiday Inn, Econo Lodge, Motel 6, Days Inn, Red Lion Inn, Suburban Ext. Stay, Holiday Inn I-95, Marriott, Hampton Inn, Ramada Inn, Red Roof Inn, Holiday Inn Express and Sleep Inn.
- Official Hotel Pick Up: 100 room nights
 Econo Lodge 10, Holiday Inn Fayetteville I-95 South 75 and Red Lion Inn & Suites 15.
